Year 3 Curriculum:

- Outline for the term is available through the Curriculum overviews on the school website.
- Science: Animals including humans, including nutrition. Forces and Magnets.
- RE: Understanding Christianity resource- focus on Gospel. Current value is Generosity.
- History: Pre-history: life in Britain during the Stone Age and Bronze Age.
- Computing: Purple Mash scheme, including the new 2BeSafe Online Safety units
- Growth Mindset - becoming independent learners, who challenge themselves.

PE:

- Will take place on Monday and Friday.
- Each half term we will send a parent mail/message on Google Classroom detailing activities and kit required for these activities.
- This half term: Dodgeball (Monday) and Swimming (Friday).
- Dodgeball: plain white t-shirt or embroidered school white t-shirt/long sleeved rugby style top, shorts/joggers, long blue socks and trainers (in case football cannot take place).
- The children can wear the long-sleeved rugby style top if they have one, but these are no longer available to buy and a plain navy sweatshirt can be worn.
- Football boots: Year 3 do not have Football in Year 3 as part of their PE lessons, so football boots are only needed for extra-curricular activities eg clubs/house football. School do have some to borrow, but not in all sizes.

Children participate in swimming lessons from Year 2 to Year 5.

Homework and Timetables:

- Homework will continue to be set on Google Classroom.
- Set on a Thursday and handed in on a Tuesday.
- Whole school approach: White Rose Infinity Quiz, spellings including rule and 5 common exception words and a Reading activity.
- We will create an overview sheet which clearly explains all homework and activities. This will be uploaded onto the class stream.
- Spelling test on a Tuesday.
- Timetables practice as much as possible each day/week.
- End of Year 3 outcome: 3, 4, 6 and 8 timetables.

- Can you find any words that have the long vowel sound /a/ but are not spelt with ei. An example word is they - ey is the long a sound but is not spelt ei.

Timetable Test Year 4:

- Children will be tested using an on-screen check where they will have to answer multiplication questions against the clock.
- Children will have 6 seconds to answer each question.
- There are 25 questions.
- Questions will be selected from the 121 number facts that make up the multiplication tables from 2 to 12, with a particular focus on the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables as they are considered to be the most challenging.
- Children will be given the opportunity to practise answering questions in this format before the official check begins.

Reading:

- Every night (minimum 5 times) with comment in their reading record. This can be reading with an adult/sibling/relative.
- Reading for pleasure and levelled reading.
- Levelled books are changed on a Monday and Thursday.
- Reading for pleasure can include any genre, listening to audio books, reading recipes etc.
- Whole Class Guided Reading once a week.
- Class Story- BFG/Wild Robot/Nothing to see here hotel.
- Reading levels and bands are checked every half term. No higher than Ruby in Year 3.
- Focus on comprehension skills- What do you think will happen next? Why do you think this? Using evidence from the book to justify their thinking.

RSE 'Changing Me':

- Content covered in the second half of Summer Term in around 3/4 sessions.
- Further information will be sent out before the lessons are taught, so you aware what is coming up.
- We use the 'Jigsaw' PSHE resource.
- Worry box throughout the sessions.

Extra bits of information:

- Water named and in the school water bottle
- Piece of fruit (dried or fresh)
- No cereal bars/fruit winders etc

Pencil cases:
